During their stay, they also visited Acton Scott Historic Working Farm, which demonstrates life on a Shropshire upland farm at the turn of the 19th century. There was plenty to do, including grinding the grain to feed the hens, feeding the lambs and most exciting of all, enjoying a cuddle with the baby chicks and ducklings. The children also enjoyed a day at Ironbridge Victorian town, where they stepped back in time to experience a morning in the schoolhouse, led by a rather strict school teacher!
