At WPS we have a superb record of children achieving places at a wide range of senior schools and this year is no different. As always, they should be justly proud of their hard work and effort and we wish them all every happiness for the future.



These results followed our very successful EYFS Inspection in November 2014, which reaffirmed that WPS is a unique and exceptional school, offering pupils much more than just an excellent education. We set our standards extremely high and value

each child as an individual, allowing them to achieve their full potential. Our wonderful Early Years staff, along with the rest of the WPS Team are all delighted that this was recognised and endorsed by the Inspectors who reported that "the overall quality, standards and care are outstanding".

Our academic achievements have, of course, been supported and enhanced by a wide range of extracurricular activities and school trips



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throughout the year, including local day trips to the library and the fire station and residential trips to York and France for our older children. Every class has benefitted from these experiences, which support and extend their classroom learning.

Fire Station visit
