Some key findings from the inspectors are that pupils:

- · make excellent progress in relation to their starting points
- achieve high standards
- excel in games and creative activities
- have excellent levels of self-confidence and self-esteem
- have excellent behaviour and an outstanding moral sense.

The report reaffirmed that Wilmslow Prep is an exceptional school, offering pupils much more than just an outstanding education. We take a nurturing approach to learning and expect much of our pupils who respond well and thoroughly enjoy their time at school, all of which was quite clearly recognised by the inspectors. What a super end to another successful year and a wonderful way to start the new term!

Following the excellent ISI report, our Form 6 children sat examinations for a wide range of Manchester Consortium Schools including AESG, Withington, Kings, Manchester High, Cheadle Hulme and Stockport Grammar, securing a total of 16 offers, including 2 academic scholarships. As always, they can be proud of their hard work and effort and we wish them all every happiness for the future.

Our strong academic achievements in the classroom are enriched and complemented by a variety of exciting extracurricular activities throughout the year. Local day trips, sporting opportunities, guest speakers, community outreach, music and drama competitions, and residential trips to York and Winmarleigh, ensure that learning thrives and flourishes both in and out of the classroom.



This year was particularly outstanding for our pupils at the 102nd Alderley Edge Festival. Over 70 WPS children participated, representing the School in choirs and individual classes for music, as well as speech and drama. Both our choirs were successful, winning the Gleave Cup (National Curriculum Year 6 and under Choir) and The Minor Cup (National Curriculum Year 3 & under Choir). In addition, 16 pupils took home prizes for individual performances. The exceptional standards displayed by all who took part was marvellous, and it is certainly one of my annual highlights!

As another fantastic school year comes to an end, I am filled with immense pride and honoured to be part of such a wonderful school family. We are confident that every child benefits from all of their experiences throughout the year, both in and out of the classroom, and we will try and share as many activities and successes in this edition of PrepTalk.
