Since 2001, Mrs Rigby has been part of the WPS family when she joined as our Reception teacher. Mrs Rigby soon became the Director of Studies from January 2002 and then Deputy Head from September 2005, when she also took up the post of Form 2 teacher. In 2014, Helen took over the reins as Headteacher.

Working with a well-established and passionate team of staff, the School has seen many changes and has achieved so much over these years:

- New, contemporary entrance lobby
- New astro-turf facility installed at the School's purpose-built Sports Hall
