
## WPS Reading Challenge

All our children were fortunate to benefit from our full interactive online learning during national lockdowns and we have seen the rewards gained from this through our assessments, where the majority of our pupils have achieved expected or higher than expected progress. WPS has grown from strength to strength and we have seen a significant growth in enquiries and new starters; this is undoubtedly due to our reputation of excellence.

At WPS, we prepare our pupils for a wide range of Senior Schools, and always had an excellent track record of children gaining entry to their first choice of school. This year has been no exception, and once again our Prep 6 pupils have excelled at their independent school entrance examinations, achieving another set of fantastic results; 16 offers in total and 4 music scholarships.

When I was offered the post of Headteacher at this fabulous school back in February 2020, no-one could have foreseen what the next 18 months would bring, but what has been clearly evident to me in particular over the course of this past academic year, is that WPS children are very adaptive, resilient and determined. These traits will obviously stand them in good stead as important life skills. As a School we have taken the approach that the well-being and safety of our families is of paramount importance, but we have continued to strive to deliver a broad and balanced curriculum, where children excel, and experience a wide range of opportunities.

Sport, music, drama are all essential elements of WPS life which not only provide children with delightful experiences, but also teach them hugely important life-lessons about working together as a team, performing to an audience and a sense of accomplishment. Whilst some activities (eg performing to a live audience, team sport against other schools) have had to be curtailed in line with Government guidelines, we have made sure that this has not diminished the children's learning and experiences by making good use of technology, and encouraging team events within our bubbles. We have also not overlooked the impact that this year has had on the children's mental health and have put in place measures to support them, for example through mental health checks during the day, additional work in our PSHEE lessons and assemblies, and by providing opportunities for our children to discuss their feelings and concerns. Children learn best when they have a positive self-image, and we have continued to encourage and embrace a growth in our pupils' individual personalities and confidence.

As you read through Prep talk I am sure you will be as impressed as I am, with how much our pupils have achieved and experienced, in spite of the external circumstances. Our sincere thanks go to all parents for your continued support and endorsement of Wilmslow Prep; this truly is a very special school and I feel highly privileged to be its Headteacher.
