# Welcome to the 2023 edition of PrepTalk.

Firstly, I would like to express my sincere gratitude to all parents and guardians for your unwavering support and trust in our School. Your partnership has been instrumental in creating an environment where our pupils can thrive academically and personally. Together, we have nurtured a love for learning and inspired our young learners to be confident individuals. This is evident in your children's outstanding achievements throughout the year.

Each year, we always strive to be better than the last. This year, without exception, our Prep 6 children have achieved outstanding academic results, receiving a total of 36 offers from excellent independent and Trafford 11+ secondary schools. These offers are a testament to their dedication, hard work, and the quality of education they have received. We congratulate each and every pupil on their achievements and wish them continued success as they embark on the next chapter of their journey.

In addition to academic excellence, our pupils have also demonstrated exceptional talent and skill in Music.Art and Drama.

At the Alderley Edge Festival we showcased the children's remarkable abilities and achieved excellent results: Five pupil choirs (52 children) were entered as well as a newly formed 16 strong staff choir, all achieving either first or second place. In addition, 28 children entered with individual music performances whilst 44 children entered speech events, with many first to third places awarded.

The talents of our children were showcased yet again in the English Speaking Board (ESB) assessments, this year, with excellent results from Prep 3 to Prep 6, 70% achieving distinctions and 30% achieving Merit Plus. We are immensely proud not only of our pupils' achievements in these assessments but also of the dedication, resilience and commitment they demonstrate to undertake such experiences and to produce such results.

Furthermore, our pupils have shone brightly in the ISA story writing competition, athletics events, and dance performances, earning them well-deserved results and accolades and bringing pride to our School and families. These achievements highlight the holistic approach we take in nurturing the talents and passions of our pupils beyond the classroom.

In enriching our pupils' educational experience, we have organised a variety of school trips. Notably, our Prep 4 pupils enjoyed a memorable trip to York, immersing themselves in history and culture. Similarly, our Prep 5 and 6 children have been on a thrilling adventure to Patterdale Hall in the Lakes, where they embraced outdoor activities and developed team-building and personal skills. These trips have provided enjoyable moments and valuable learning



opportunities outside the traditional classroom setting.

Additionally, the children have also dedicated their efforts to support charities such as Cystic Fibrosis, Poppy Appeal, Barnardos, Marie Curie and Save the Children. Through our collective efforts and working together to make a difference we have raised £3000.

As we bid farewell to our Prep 6, we celebrate their personal achievements and the bright futures that await them. They have grown into exceptional individuals, equipped with the knowledge, skills, and values instilled at WPS. We have no doubt that they will make a positive impact at senior school.

Finally, I would like to wish all our families a restful and enjoyable summer break. Take this time to relax, create lasting memories with your family, and recharge for the adventures that lie ahead. We eagerly look forward to welcoming you back in the new academic year, ready for another year of growth, discovery, and success at WPS.


Ms McVey spoke to the children about the workings of Parliament and her role as our local MP. Her feedback on the quality of questions was that they were outstanding!

#### **ESB Excellence**

The English Speaking Board exams, taken by Prep 5 & 6, are highly valued at WPS as they build confidence and give the children experience in public speaking from an early age.

It's not easy to speak in front of an audience of your peers plus an external examiner but all of the children took the exam in their stride. 70% of the children were awarded Distinctions and the remainder Merit+'s.

Not to be outdone, Prep 3 & 4 undertook their ESBs in the summer term and all children were awarded at least a Merit, with all Prep 4 entrants achieving Distinction: amazing! The process of these exams really do engender important life skills and to achieve such results at this young age is a real testament to pupils and staff alike.
