F6: Scarlett for a fabulous PowerPoint about World War 2.



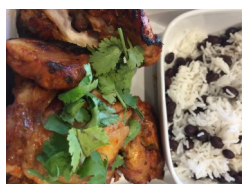
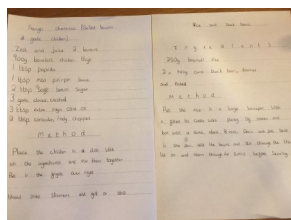
Sun Smart
