

## THE WILMSLOW PREP Pathway



# PHASE 1 DISCOVERY

In the Discovery phase your child will start their love of learning through exploration, work and play in a small, kind, friendly, nurturing and well-resourced environment. We introduce and develop the following:

- Fundamental elements of Reading, Writing, Spoken Language (including sequencing and vocabulary development), Mathematics and Science.
- Creative skills through a wide variety of experiences.
- Strong fine and gross motor skills.
- Knowledge and understanding of the world around us.
- Specialist Teachers for PE, Music and Modern Foreign Languages, enhancing the breadth and depth of knowledge and skills.

- Learning Support from specialist SENCO to develop and/or extend individuals' learning.
- Teaching Assistant support across the curriculum, ensuring a highly tailored focus for individuals' learning and progress.
- Baseline assessments, to carefully track and monitor progress and inform next steps.
- Strong partnerships with families to consolidate learning at school.

Regular communication is vital throughout all stages of your child's Pathway, and particularly in his or her first years at WPS. We welcome regular informal communication – staff make themselves available at the earliest convenience to discuss any aspect of your child's performance.

# PHASE 2 STRONG CORE

In the Strong Core phase our children transition from play based learning to a more formal learning environment, strengthening their independence and learning processes ready for the juniors, through:

- Clearly defined programmes of study for every area of the curriculum, providing a robust and carefully planned structure for the development of knowledge and skills.
- Extension of skills and understanding in the key curriculum areas of Reading, Writing, Spoken Language, Mathematics and Science.
- Individual, specific targets for learning in English and Mathematics.
- Differentiated and tailored lessons to meet the needs of each individual.
- Skills extension in handwriting and presentation.
- Enhanced knowledge and understanding of the world with a carefully planned Humanities curriculum.

- Specialist Teachers for Science, Computing, Drama and Art/Design Technology in addition to the Phase I Specialist Teachers (PE, Music and Modern Foreign Languages).
- Learning Support from specialist SENCO providing tailored programmes of work for all levels of ability, including Gifted and Talented.
- Teaching Assistant Support for core curriculum (English and Mathematics) ensuring a highly tailored focus for individuals' learning and progress.
- Using and applying knowledge and procedures to solve problems and develop skills in spoken and written language.
- Formal and informal tests and careful tracking and monitoring of progress. By the end of this phase, the children will have a strong core set of skills and have already become independent creative thinkers and problem solvers, growing in confidence and ready to meet the pace and challenges of the WPS Junior years.



## PHASE 3 EXTENDING BOUNDARIES

In the Extending Boundaries phase the pace and challenge step up and we extend the boundaries of each child's potential and start the preparation for senior school choice.

The Senior School Transition Leaders, alongside the Form Teachers will talk to you about your aspirations for your child's senior school progression and share their thoughts.

Our expectations are of increased focus and concentration from your child to reach their full potential in Form 6, and are achieved through:

- Extended goals for learning.
- Individual, tailored learning targets in English and Mathematics.
- Development of confidence and competence with key skills, including quick recall of key facts.

- Tailored teaching to reflect individual needs.
- Higher Level Teaching Assistant (HLTA) support for core curriculum (English and Mathematics) to enable focus on extension activities, and develop further understanding as needed.
- Specialist Teachers for PE, Music, Modern Foreign Languages, Science, Computing, Drama and Art/Design Technology.
- Formal and informal tests, and careful tracking and monitoring of progress.
- Learning Support from specialist SENCO providing tailored programmes of work for all levels of ability, including Gifted and Talented.
- Verbal and Non-Verbal Reasoning as part of the curriculum in preparation for senior school examinations.
- Further development of independence, along with organisational and time-management skills.
- High expectation of quality and quantity of work produced in a given time-frame.

The combination of increased focus on development of the skills noted above, and the meticulous tracking of progress mean that at this stage we are already starting your child's preparation for senior school entrance examinations, whilst developing an enduring love of learning and providing many opportunities for each child to shine.



## PHASE 4 SENIOR TRANSITION

FORMS 5 AND 6

In the final phase of the Wilmslow Prep Pathway we build on the prior phases, accelerating our emphasis on tailored teaching for each pupil, which means that your child has a choice of senior school that is right for them at 11.

Our experienced Senior School Transition Leaders ensure personalised communication about the progress of your child. Our successful track record in enabling choice at 11, over many years, is built on the following:


- Timetabling which prioritises English and Mathematics.
