Message from the Headteacher

The Greek philosopher Heraclitus talked about Character as Destiny. It is interesting that he also talked about change being ever present and that humans are in a state of 'becoming'. We now enter our final half term of the academic year with mixed emotions as the Prep 6 children will be leaving us, but we are extremely proud of all they have achieved at WPS. I am looking forward with great enthusiasm and excitement to my first WPS Speech Day where we will be celebrating and showcasing all the wonderful talents and achievements of our pupils!


